Module 1: Europeana: transform education with digital culture

- The course participant who has successfully passed this module has achieved the following learning objectives:
- 1. Discussing and exploring what cultural heritage is, and its importance (including the 2018 European Year of cultural heritage);
- 2. Becoming familiar with the Europeana platform, and its work in education;
- 3. Exploring the first part of the Learning Scenario.



Module 2: Search and use Europeana Collections to teach your subject

The course participant who has successfully passed this module has achieved the following learning objectives:

1. Understanding what the Europeana Collections are and the benefits of using them in their lessons;

2. Learning how to search the Europeana Collections for relevant content, navigating copyright information and correctly attributing cultural records;

3. Exploring Europeana's curated resources (thematic collections, online exhibitions and galleries) and the possibilities for using them in teaching;

4. Continuing to explore the learning scenario.



#### Module 3: Explore Europeana educational tools and resources

The course participant who has successfully passed this module has achieved the following learning objectives:

1. Learning about ready-to-use digital learning resources and tools available for teaching, developed by Europeana and selected partners;

2. Continuing to explore the learning scenario, step 3;

3. Getting the opportunity to participate in a TeachMeet where part of the Developer Group presented their Learning Scenarios.



Module 4: Design learning scenarios with Europeana content and resources

The course participant who has successfully passed this module has achieved the following learning objectives:

1. Exploring 5 learning scenarios which use Europeana resources;

2. Learning about tools and selected methodologies, such as PBL, Augmented Reality or STEAM subjects;

3. Finding examples of 21st-century skills for students in the context of learning scenarios, and how Europeana can contribute to their development.



Module 5: Assess cultural heritage lessons: towards 21st-century skills

1. Receiving an introduction to general assessment approaches;
